Covid vaccin will be free throughout Sweden

Vaccine against Corona (Covid-19) will soon be arriving in Kalmar County. It will be free of charge for everyone.

But first, everyone is waiting for the various vaccines to be approved. Those to be used in Europe is undergoing thorough examinations in the EU. They cannot be used before being approved.

As soon as the vaccine arrives in Sweden, the vaccinations will begin. If distributions and tests go well, the first doses will be here by January 2021.

Those who have the greatest need for protection will receive the first doses of vaccine. The Swedish Public Health Agency has made a priority list of the order in which to vaccinate.

- 1. People who live in care homes for the elderly or have home care.
- 2. Staff in elderly care, health care and medical care.
- 3. People who live with, and have close contact with, people who have home care.

Those living in care homes for elderly will be vaccinated there. Other people will then be offered the vaccine and can book their vaccinations themselves.

More information is coming up later on.

When everyone in the priority groups has been vaccinated, it will be available for others. The Swedish Public Health Agency believes that everyone can be vaccinated by fall 2021

The vaccine will come to Sweden in different rounds. They are then distributed directly to the regions who are responsible for the vaccinations.

The vaccine is free for everyone.

Sweden has bought several kinds of vaccine. They differ a bit from each other. Some may be better suited for the elderly. Others may be more suitable if you have a certain disease. How different vaccines will be offered to different groups will be decided when more knowledge exists in that matter.

The vaccine comes from several pharmaceutical companies.

When someone in the household is infected, everyone should stay at home

If someone has a confirmed Corona (Covid-19), everyone else who lives in the same household must also stay at home. If the person staying at home does not get any symptoms after seven days, that person can return to school or work. If someone has been tested, they must wait until they have received a response to the test results.
